The political role of the military in Indonesia; Indonesian political parties, particularly campaign financing issues; elections in Indonesia; comparative electoral politics in Southeast Asia.



This seminar will discuss Dr. Marcus Mietzner's forthcoming book (to be published by Cornell University Press in 2023) on presidential coalition-building in Indonesia. It argues that the remarkable stability of the post-2004 regime in Indonesia has been due to the effective use of coalitional presidentialism strategies towards a wide variety of actors, including non-party groups. But while this approach has secured the regime's stability, it has also undermined democratic quality — producing a defective democracy that maintains minimalist standards of electoral functionality but is far from the kind of gradually deepening democratic polity many activists had envisaged when long-time autocrat Suharto fell in 1998.
